Started in 2016, from an initial collaboration with Ryan and his peers, the Amplify Series has grown into

a multi-year project that has shared the voices and artistry of dozens of youth, composers, and performers. The words of these young writers have brought smiles and tears to audiences across the country, and members of the autism community have expressed feeling heard, valued, and seen through these concerts. Now, LYNX is bringing their Amplify Series to Lewis University. Join us for an evening celebrating these songs and come to understand individuals whose voices are valuable but so rarely heard.
